

## Workshop 2- "Energy for a Modern Danube Region"

Despite major steps towards the integration of the EU's energy market, work is still needed to have a fully integrated, competitive market in place by 2014 (Council conclusions of 4 February 2011). As underlined in the Energy Roadmap 2050, the integration and opening of the energy networks and systems coupling is of key importance to make the transition to a low-carbon economy and maintain secure supplies at the lowest possible cost. The Danube Region Strategy can play an important role in bridging the gaps between Member State as well as the EU and non-EU countries by coordinating common positions. From the Strategy perspective, this workshop will analyse three major challenges: (i) the internal energy market integration; (ii) the deployment of smart grids at European, regional and municipal level; and (iii) the modernization of the networks in order to integrate the renewable energy.
