- EUSALP process was originally launched by the regions, therefore a "bottom-up" approach
- ensure that the Alpine Region remains one of the most attractive and competitive areas in Europe
- integrated approach: through coordination of actions across policy areas it is expected to achieve better results than individual initiatives
- EUSALP puts particular attention to the relationship and solidarity between the mountainous regions in the centre of the macro-region and the surrounding lowlands and metropolitan areas
- EUSALP is transnational or transregional and multilevel



Action plan: AG 9 mission



- Promotion of energy efficiency and the production and use of clean and renewable energy in line with the EU's policy goals (e.g. Energy Union Package, 2009/28/EU, 2010/31/EU, 2012/27/EU, ...)
- Reduction of energy consumption and enhancemnet of energy efficiency in the public and private sectors
- Development of a macroregional energy strategy that takes into account ecological, economical and land use issues and that considers societal trade-offs
- security of energy supply, interconnection, integrated markets, more independence, ...
