- 3 new programmes succeeding SEE : ADRION, Balkan-Mediterranean, Danube
- CZ has been included in the Danube cooperation programme



Austria; Bosnia and Herzegovina; Bulgaria; Croatia; Czech Republic; Germany: Baden-Wuertemberg; Bavaria; Hungary; the Republic of Moldova; Montenegro; Romania; Serbia; Slovakia; Slovenia; Ukraine: Chernivetska Oblast, Ivano-Frankiviska Oblast, Zakarpatska Oblast, Odessa Oblast.

Partners from EU nonmember states can use: *Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance* (IPA)/*European Neighbourhood Instrument* (ENI)

### Implementation structure

- <u>Managing Authority(MA) a Joint Secretariat(JS)</u>: Responsible for overall programme implementation
  - Ministry of Finance, Budapest (HU)
  - JS international staffing financial and project managers
- Monitoring committee: representatives of member states on national and regional level
  - Common decision reviews the implementation of the programme and progress towards achieving its objectives, selects and approves applications to be financed
- National coordinator, contact points network:
  - MMR; Department of European Territorial Cooperation



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#### Thematic focus

#### Innovative and socially responsible Danube region

### 1.1. Improve framework conditions for innovation

- Contribute to developing an excellent research infrastructure joint planning and management of research infrastructures with a transnational scope
- Support the improved coordination of cluster policies and cluster cooperation projects that lead to joint innovation and the development of joint smart specialisation approaches
- Establish transnational networks between appropriate partners to develop and implement products, services
- Develop and implement strategies and instruments to provide better access to innovation finance and support for innovative start-ups

### 1.2. Increase competences for business and social innovation

• Support strategic approaches of transnational educational and training networks

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- Develop joint tools and services to improve competences for innovative entrepreneurship
- Support mutual learning and cooperation to increase skills of employees and employers
- Support the joint development of skills and knowledge for implementation of social innovation (migration, health, ageing...)
- Raise awareness on learning systems for development of open innovation

## 2.1. Foster sustainable use of natural and cultural heritage and resources

• Improve frameworks and develop joint and integrated solutions for sustainable tourism ("green tourism")

•Implement common strategies to develop common approaches for the protection and sustainable use of natural and cultural heritage

•Support activities in the fields of multiculturalism, cultural exchange

• Support joint strategies for the management and protection of natural resources

## 2.2. Foster the restoration and management of ecological corridors

• Support strategic frameworks and develop concrete solutions to restore, conserve and improve a network of green infrastructures/ bio-corridors of TN relevance

• Improve the knowledge base and build up consistent and reliable data information sources

- Foster integrated approaches on soil protection and soil awareness
- Strenghten the capacities and the networks of NGO's, stakeholders and authorities involved in preserving biodiversity and nature protection

#### 2.3. Strengthen transnational water management and flood risk prevention

- Contribute to the common transboundary implementation of the Flood directive (joint flood monitoring and alert systems)
- Better integrate policies to prevent deterioration of groundwater quality and the concentrations of pollutants in groundwater
- •Encourage more effective information sharing, mutual learning and a sustainable approach to managing the risks of floods
- Contribute to proper fluvial and sediment management to track sediment transport and morphological changes along the river system

## 2.4. Improve preparedness for disaster risk management

- Development of joint strategies and action plans for risk management
- Building up a common knowledge base and data observation capacities, and mechanisms for the exchange of information,
- •Joint efforts in making future scenarios for risk management
- Joint development of tools, e.g. developing modern management systems



#### 3 – Better connected and energy responsible Danube region

3.1. Support environmentally-friendly and safe transport systems and balanced accessibility of urban and rural areas

• Contribute to the development of integrated transport frameworks and other joint coordination measures

• Contribute to a better organisation of public transport links and other sustainable modes of transport in functional urban and rural areas.

• Encourage joint planning and development of urban, interurban and cross-border bicycle routes. Support multimodal bicycle tourism.

• Contribute to ensure accessibility of rural areas, especially those affected by demographic change

•Contribute to better integrated policies and practical solutions to further develop waterways by exchanging and transferring know-how and good practice (waterway infrastructure, port development) 3.2. Improve energy security and energy efficiency

• Contribute to the transnational integration of different energy networks and explore the development opportunities for a joint energy infrastructure

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• Contribute to regional energy planning and -coordination of transnational relevance within the wider context of EU energy policy

• Contribute to practical transnational coordination of developing energy efficiency concepts.

# Call for proposal

- 1. call mid September 2015
- <u>2 steps</u> procedure: timetable depending on programme approval
  - 1. Expression of Interest
  - 2. full Application Form
- <u>P1, P2, P3, P4.1</u> allocated up to 40% of overall budget
- Projects of maximum <u>30 months</u> + 2 months for financial closure
- Reimbursement principle 2x a year certification of expenditures
