Guidelines for EUSDR Strategic Projects/Processes













EUSDR Strategic Projects/Processes OR EUSDR Flagships...

- Provide a practical tool for stakeholders and particularly the EUSDR participating states, to explicitly foster projects and processes with a strategic character;
- Produce regional, national and international/transnational visibility for the EUSDR and its actions and targets while creating awareness
 among the general public and the EUSDR stakeholders;
- Highlight the progress achieved in implementing the EUSDR and thus strengthening the internal and external communication;
- Strengthen a sector or branch, or generating value chains or model solutions to important common challenges faced within the Danube Region;
- Contribute to strong and clear strategic focus of the activities and efforts undertaken within the EUSDR Priority Areas as well as
 highlighting the ambition and direction a PA has in a certain policy area;
- Support and further encouraging cooperation among EUSDR participating states and/or regions;
- Strengthen the ground to further **embed** the EUSDR strategic topics jointly agreed by all participating countries of the EUSDR **into EU funding programmes** 2021-2027 and beyond;
- **Promote the EUSDR** and through the implementation of strategic projects and processes the idea of transnational cooperation and **cohesion policy** in Europe and the Danube region.











Proposed scope and criteria

- Can be projects (single or grouped in clusters), processes, networks, platforms etc.
- Can be planning/preparatory phase, in implementation/ongoing phase or completed
- Must fulfil the following three criteria:
 - a) Connection to the EUSDR: Deliver on or contribute to one or more targets and Actions described in the EUSDR Action Plan.
 - **b)** Macro-regional dimension: Involve at least three EUSDR participating states (or at least two participating states and a neighbouring country) and have a high macro-regional impact (effect) in at least three participating states from the Danube Region.
 - c) Multi-level governance approach: Involve different actors (e.g. policy makers, policy implementers, research institutions, civil society etc.) and/or several levels (supranational, national, regional, local) in the development/consultation and/or implementation process.













Proposed course of action



Guidance paper for identifying and listing EUSDR strategic projects/processes

• Guidance paper – including definition, purpose and criteria for EUSDR strategic projects/ processes – drafted by the DSP in consultation with the PAs, endorsed by the NCs



Identification of EUSDR strategic projects/processes

- Selection of strategic projects and/or processes by PAs
- Submission of the EUSDR strategic project/process template by the PACs to the DSP
- Support and collection of templates from all PAs by the DSP



Labelling completed

- List of EUSDR strategic projects and processes on the EUSDR website, regularly updated and maintained by the DSP
- 'Certificate' for each EUSDR strategic project/process provided by the DSP
- Distribution of EUSDR strategic projects and processes among NCs and other EUSDR stakeholders by the DSP



Communication measures for more visibility

- Promotion of EUSDR strategic projects and processes by the DSP through website, social media, publications and/or other communication tools
- Potential promotion on national and transnational level by EUSDR stakeholders
